This letter is a proposal to form a high school <i>Model G20 In Action</i> club, which would address our student body's interest in international relations, current events, and cultural awareness. The goal of this club is to bring global understanding and leadership skills to the school, district, and community in a fun, collaborative, skill-building way.
MG20 In Action is designed to be largely student-run, allowing students to build leadership skills. All club members will have the opportunity to act as facilitators.
Members of the club engage with real-world issues through activities, discussions, hands-on projects, and simulations. Students develop the skills, mindset, and confidence to take on leadership roles and responsibilities after high school. Below is a sample 4-week plan for the club using <i>MG20 In Action</i> 's pre-made club curriculum:
 Week 1: a workshop to practice specific skills, such as public speaking Weeks 2 and 3: a 2-week role-play simulation dealing with a global issue or concern Week 4: a roundtable discussion exploring a current event
Club members also have the opportunity to travel and continue to develop their diplomatic skills with international peers by attending Model G20 Summits, held throughout the year in locations around the world.




